PURPOSE OF THE REPORT | TE TAKE MŌ TE PŪRONGO

The purpose of this report is to inform Councillors of the approach staff propose following calls for submissions from the Environment Select Committee on the following draft legislation:

- a. Climate Change Response (Zero Carbon Bill) Amendment Bill; and
- b. Kāinga Ora Homes and Communities Bill.

CONTEXT | HOROPAKI

- 1. The Queenstown Lakes District Council (QLDC) has received calls for submissions on the following proposed legislation currently before the Environment Select Committee:
 - c. Climate Change Response (Zero Carbon) Amendment Bill; and
 - d. Kāinga Ora Homes and Communities Bill.

ANALYSIS AND ADVICE | TATĀRITANGA ME NGĀ TOHUTOHU

- With respect to the Climate Change Response (Zero Carbon) Amendment Bill, officers (including the QLDC's legal team) have reviewed the draft legislation and conclude that the impacts for QLDC are largely operational. For this reason, officers propose that it is appropriate for the Chief Executive to respond directly. A draft submission for Councillors is appended for information and comment.
- 3 Kāinga Ora Homes and Communities Bill currently before the Select Committee is the first of two bills. The main purpose of the first bill is to establish a new Crown entity to be named Kāinga Ora Homes and Communities. The new entity will have two main roles:
 - a. Public housing landlord; and
 - b. Leading urban development projects.
- 4 The first bill proposes to disestablish Housing New Zealand Corporation (HNZC) and HLC, a wholly-owned subsidiary of HNZC, which was established in 2006 to develop the former Hobsonville Airforce Base into a new township. It also proposes to transfer some of the functions and assets of Kiwibuild to the new entity.
- The second function of Kāinga Ora Homes and Communities will be addressed through a second bill to be introduced later in 2019. Officers propose that it is not necessary to submit on the first bill but that QLDC would look to submit on the second bill given possible implications for housing supply in the district.
- 6 Councillors are asked to note the advice from staff that the Chief Executive will submit on the Climate Change Response (Zero Carbon) Amendment Bill, and that QLDC will respond to the second part of the Kāinga Ora Homes and Community Bill later this year.
