Resource Management Act 1991 - Public Notice of the Operative Date of the Queenstown Lakes District Plan

Pursuant to Clause 20 of the First Schedule to the Resource Management Act 1991 the Queenstown Lakes District Council gives public notice that on **25 July 2005** the Queenstown Lakes District Plan will become **operative** with respect to those parts of the Proposed Plan identified in the decision of the Environment Court (88/2005) dated 27 June 2005.

Road to be Closed: Ardmore Street from Shooters Bar to Dungarvon Street.
Period of Closure: 3.30 pm on Friday 16 September 2005 to 10.30 pm on Sunday 18th September 2005.

It will be an offence under the above regulations for any person otherwise than under authority of an authorised permit to use the roads for ordinary vehicular traffic during the period of closure.

Proposed Crown Range Road Restriction – Goods Service and Passenger Service Vehicles

The Queenstown Lakes District Council has recently called for public submissions on the proposed restriction of Goods Service Vehicles on the Crown Range Road. Due to an administrative error, the Council failed to advertise a subsequent restriction on buses and coaches.

The Council has now resolved to invite fresh or additional submissions on both sets of restrictions, i.e. goods service vehicles and buses and coaches. Any individual or organisation is invited to make submissions on the proposed restrictions set out below.

The proposed restrictions are:

The use of the Crown Range Road be restricted as to absolutely prohibit the use of such Road between State Highway 6 at Whitechapel and Bridge No 11 by any Goods Service or Passenger Service Vehicle exceeding 14,200kg gross laden weight or any Goods Service or Passenger Service Vehicle exceeding 12.6m overall length; such restriction / prohibition to be subject to the conditions that it not apply for the access of such prohibited vehicles to properties situated within the prohibited zone; nor to vehicles involved in the maintenance and upkeep of the Crown Range Road and intersecting Roads; nor in cases where there has been a temporary closure exceeding three hours in duration of State Highway 6 between Cromwell and Whitechapel; nor to any vehicle for which a valid permit has been issued in accordance with Clause 7 of the Heavy Motor Vehicles Regulations 1975 and/or Section 5 of the Land Transport Rule: Vehicle Dimensions and Mass 2002.

Persons considering submitting should note that the Council is permitted to amend the terms of the restrictions in response to submissions without further advertising.
