

STAGE 1 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT - EARLY INSIGHTS SUMMARY

The Wanaka Town Centre Masterplan project started in July 2018. This is an exciting opportunity to get ahead of the game and improve how the Wanaka Town Centre looks, feels and functions in the future. The process takes a holistic view and draws from all the great work already done on strategies and plans for the Wanaka area. It will also include a preferred programme of transport improvements which will allow for better access to and through the town centre and the wider urban area of Wanaka.

We kicked off community engagement with an early insights campaign where we went out to the Upper Clutha community over the month of September and asked what would make them spend more time in town. We were keen to get a better feel for what people cherished about the town centre, but also what they found challenging and what changes they'd like to see happen now and in the future.

To start the conversation we... identified key themes from past plans and strategies and asked, does this reflect what you would like incorporated into a Masterplan for the Wanaka Town Centre? To recap, the themes were:

ENHANCE AND PROTECT THE PRISTINE NATURAL LANDSCAPE AND LAKEFRONT VIEWS

WELL-CONNECTED AND COMPREHENSIVE CYCLE-PATHS AND WALKWAYS

VEHICLE FREE ROADS TO PRIORITISE PEDESTRIANS AND CYCLISTS

SAFE INTEGRATED LINK FROM LAKEFRONT TO THE TOWN CENTRE IMPROVED ROAD DESIGN AND SAFER SPEED LIMITS

AFFORDABLE PUBLIC TRANSPORT

It's great to hear from the community that we are heading in the right direction. 33% agreed somewhat with these themes, feeling we'd missed some elements or wanted to expand on some we'd touched on.

We asked:

What one thing you would change today to improve the town centre?

Here's what you said:

- 1. PEDESTRIANISATION OF HELWICK AND ARDMORE STREET
- 2. REMOVE PARKING ON LAKEFRONT AND PROVIDE DESIGNATED PARKING AREA FOR CAMPERVANS
- 3. REMOVE SPEED BUMPS ON ARDMORE STREET OR CONVERT TO ZEBRA CROSSING
- 4. MORE SHORT AND LONG TERM PARKING OPTIONS
- 5. ACTIVE TRAVEL ENCOURAGED THROUGH IMPROVED CYCLE PATHS, BIKE HIRE AND DROP LOCK STATIONS
- 6. PUBLIC ART AND PERFORMING ART FACILITY
- 7. CENTRAL CAR PARKING BUILDING
- 8. ENHANCED PUBLIC REALM INCLUDING SEATED AREAS, GREEN SPACES, STREET LIGHTING AND WIND PROTECTION
- 9. AFFORDABLE PUBLIC TRANSPORT OPTIONS
- 10. INTEGRATION OF BUSINESS ACTIVITIES WITH STREETSCAPE SUCH AS CAFÉ TABLES AND STREET MARKET

Looking ahead 30 years what is one thing that would motivate you, your kids or your grandkids to spend more time in your town centre?

- 5. VIBRANT AND INTIMATE TOWN WITH AUTHENTIC RETAIL OFFERING

- 6. ENVIRONMENTAL SUSTAINABILITY
- 7. CONNECTIVITY TO THE LAKEFRONT
- 8. INTERACTIVE AND WELL CONNECTED COMMUNITY SPACES
- 9. SAFE ACCESS FOR PEDESTRIANS AND CYCLISTS
- 10. ADEQUATE CAR PARKING FACILITIES

ONLINE CONVERSATION – A SNAPSHOT OF COMMENTS

- My hope for the future is to be able to keep some semblance of our old Wanaka alive, albeit with many more residents and tourists being there, let's keep the authenticity of our original Wanaka, no box stores, no cheap take always, keep the core quaint and get rid of the vehicles..."
- A safe and attractive small town with beautiful protected landscape"
- Fewer vehicles in the centre of town which means discouraging parking and encouraging public transport. A useful idea would to be to consider now public transport (light electric rail for instance) between the current town centre and Three Parks."
- More pedestrian space, and more space where public areas and seating spaces are in the pedestrian area -- like Cuba Street in Wellington! The cars in the town centre completely ruin the whole atmosphere, and upset the relaxed pace we could have there..."
- Activities for locals museums, galleries, playgrounds, markets with free or discounted access. Encourage diversity and lower-socioeconomic families to stay..."

- Thinking about the past, Wanaka was always a place of calm, rest and education. A town centre that offers the ability to celebrate this past with shared spaces for relaxing while taking in the surroundings, a direct link to the lakefront, removal of vehicles, educational resources, engagement with town businesses and a place to connect locals and visitors. A real hub of a thriving but relaxed town that shows the importance of bringing people together."
- Continue to make it a vibrant area. Keeping the ambience does not mean no change, boring. Bars, restaurants, fun shops, quality shops, street entertainment. Keep it coming."
- A well designed and integrated car free space around Helwick Street and Ardmore St. This public space would form the heart of the community and link the town to the lake in the same way that Earnslaw Park (and St Omer Park to a lesser extent) do in Queenstown. The idea is not to become another Queenstown, but also not be afraid to incorporate ideas that have worked well there, like Steamer Wharf."
- Dinosaur park for adults in current car park near lake. Imagine if you actually went to town to have a stretch workout!
