# Sector Change and NZTA Requirements

- Shift from prescriptive to risk-based framework
- NZTA and industry groups are calling NZGTTM a “generational change”
- Uptake by industry and local authorities (LA’s) has been cautious to date
- To prompt faster adoption NZTA have retired CoPTTM and require LA’s to transition to NZGTTM, as a condition of funding


# QLDC Dual Role and Implications

- Council has dual responsibilities as an organisation.
  - Funding, procuring and managing physical works, where duties are under the HSWA as a PCBU;
  - As a Road Controlling Authority, managing and approving activities within the road corridor under the LGA.

# What Will Change?

- Traffic management tailored to the specific activity and proportionate to the actual risk
- Emphasis on evidence-based submissions rather than layout-based compliance
- Stronger coordination between Council, contractors, and utility operators seeking corridor access
- Outcome-focused assurance to confirm risks are well managed in practice

- Provide targeted internal training for project teams and RCA staff
- Hold contractor and utility operator briefings to support adoption
