## Potential Key Moves

- 1 Modal Shift**
  - Walking, cycling and public transport as first choice to move around
- 2 Connect**
  - Ensure quality pedestrian and bus links to communities within and beyond Te Pūtahi: Ladies Mile
  - Provide safe connections across SH-6 with reduced speed, higher amenity streetscape and multiple attractive pedestrian crossing options
  - New connection to Sylvan Street
- 3 High serviceability**
  - Ensure high frequency bus service within walking distance of new and existing development
  - Utilise existing services and improve capacity with new bus lands and improved route
- 4 Community**
  - Provide Medium and High density living to support high frequency public transport, community facilities and walking/ cycling amenities
  - Community facilities co-located with sports hub to provide more local services, employment and to support improved public transport
- 5 Ladies Mile Corridor (State Highway 6)**
  - Consider Ladies Mile as a boulevard with high amenity landscaping, walking, cycling, dedicated bus lanes and high quality bus stops.
  - Reduce speed environment
  - Consider signalised and underpass options for walking and cycling
  - Frequent bus service along SH-6 within easy walking distance of residential areas and the Transport Hub.
  - Added bus lanes to SH-6 to improve reliability, frequency and journey time.
