Glenorchy-Queenstown Road – Proposal






One Mile roundabout to west of Sunshine Bay:

- Proposed reduction to 60km/h
 - 60km/h to align with proposed slower speeds through communities further along the route

Glenorchy-Queenstown Road – Proposal




- Proposed 80km/h for Glenorchy Queenstown Road

Glenorchy-Queenstown Road – Proposal






Glenorchy–Queenstown Road approaching Glenorchy from Queenstown:


