## PUBLIC NOTICE OF A PLAN CHANGE TO THE QUEENSTOWN-LAKES PARTIALLY OPERATIVE DISTRICT PLAN

Pursuant to Clause 5 of the First Schedule to the Resource Management Act 1991 the Queenstown Lakes District Council gives public notice as of **Wednesday 16 January 2008** that it has prepared the following Plan Change to the Partially Operative District Plan:

## Plan Change 28 - Trails

This plan change seeks to remove obstacles to the provision of trails (walking, cycling, bridleways etc), particularly in the rural area, due to trails previously being considered public places when assessing development or subdivision applications under the District Plan. The Plan Change proposes that trails formed after December 2007 no longer be considered public places.

Any person may make a submission to the proposed Plan Change. Submission forms are available from the above locations. The closing date for submissions is **18 February 2008**. Submissions must be in writing and must be sent to the following address:

Following the receipt of public submissions, a summary of the decisions requested will be prepared. This will be publicly notified and any person may lodge a further submission in support or opposition to any original submission.

The Council will appoint a Hearing Committee to assess the Plan Change and the submissions lodged to it, including further submissions. The Committee will hold a public hearing to enable submitters to present their submissions.

Following deliberation, a decision will be issued by the Council to withdraw, retain or modify the plan change. Any person who was a submitter, or lodged a further submission, and who is not satisfied with the decision reached, may appeal that decision to the Environment Court.
