COVID-19 - Update 55 - Monday 4 October 2021

Here's the latest update from the Southern Lakes Business Response & Recovery team

Here's the latest information for businesses on COVID-19 following the Prime Minister's 4.00pm update today.

The Prime Minister has announced that Auckland will remain in Alert Level 3 but some restrictions will be eased from midnight tomorrow. This will be a <u>three-stage roadmap</u> to easing restrictions, with each stage scheduled a week apart, subject to the government reviewing it prior.

Parts of the Waikato including Hamilton city remains at the original Alert Level 3 and will not follow the three-stage roadmap process whilst the Government and MoH wait for further information.

Cabinet has agreed the rest of New Zealand will remain at Alert Level 2 - with the only change being the 100 person limit in hospitality venues removed. The requirement to ensure patrons are seated and separated remains.

At the end of these steps, the Government stated the plan is to then move to a national framework that reflects a more highly vaccinated population, allowing the ability to deal with riskier settings such as large-scale events with the use of vaccine certificates.

The Prime Minister emphasized that even with the changes in the tiered level 3, the financial support, with both the wage subsidy and the resurgence support payment will continue, as long as part of the country is in a form of Level 3 and 2 respectively.

What's New

Immigration NZ - 2021 Resident Visa

Immigration New Zealand has announced a <u>one-off residence pathway - 2021 Resident Visa</u>. This will be available to people who have already submitted a resident visa application under the Skilled Migrant Category (SMC) and Residence from Work (RfW) category and those who have submitted an SMC Expression of Interest, as well as other work visa holders who may not have been eligible through the current skilled residence pathways. Applications open in two phases – the first round opens on 1 December 2021.

The 2021 Resident Visa will be available to most holders of work-related visas – including Essential Skills, Work to Residence, and Post Study Work visas – and their immediate family members.

Wage Subsidy and Resurgence Payment

The Government has approved a fourth round of COVID-19 wage subsidy payment. Auckland remaining at Alert Level 3 triggers another fortnight of wage subsidy payment for eligible businesses, applications opened last Friday.

- Eligibility is determined by a drop in revenue caused by any part of the country being in Alert Level 3 or 4.
- Applications for the fourth COVID-19 Wage Subsidy August 2021 are currently open and will close at 11.59pm Thursday 14 October.
- Another round of the Resurgence Support Payment is also available from Friday 8 October

Changes to QR code display requirements:

The Government has introduced some changes to the Alert Level Order to improve ease of access to QR codes for customers visiting a business or public facilities.

People in control of workplaces must now ensure that:

- 1. Additional copies of a COVID-19 QR code will need to be displayed in other places throughout businesses and locations (which are already required to display them). This is in addition to an already required QR code displayed at the main entrance.
- 2. QR code posters are now also required to kept in a good condition, this limits the risk that scanning doesn't take place if posters are faded, damaged or difficult to scan in on.
- 3. The QR code must not be altered in a way that makes it unclear that it has been issued by the NZ Government for the purposes of contact tracing. Businesses and locations must use the official COVID-19 QR code posters issued by the Ministry of Health. This also ensures people know the QR code they are scanning links to the COVID tracer app and is for contact tracing purposes.

Public transport operators must now ensure that:

- 1. display additional copies of QR codes. This is in addition to the existing requirement to display a copy in a prominent place on or inside any vehicle (vehicles with 5 or fewer seats, including taxis and ride shares are exempt from needing to display additional copies).
- 2. QR code posters are required to be in good condition.
- 3. the QR code must not be altered in a way that makes it unclear that it has been issued by the NZ Government for the purposes of contact tracing.

Air New Zealand has <u>announced a 'no jab no fly' policy</u> which will come into effect from 1 February 2022 - the airline will require customers travelling anywhere on its international network to be fully vaccinated.
