## CONTEXT | HOROPAKI

### **Covid-19 Emergency Response**

- 1. Steve Batstone (Recovery Manager) will join the meeting at approximately 10.30am (via Zoom) to brief the Board about the Council's Strategic Recovery Plan. His presentation will be circulated separately to Board members.
- 2. The Kia Kaha Queenstown Lakes Community Hub will be operating on 16 June from the Wanaka Community Hub. Two workshops will be held, the first 10.00pm-12.30pm primarily aimed at employers, the second 2.00pm-4.30pm and this will have an employee and community focus.
- 3. Representatives from Immigration New Zealand, lawyers, travel experts and social service providers will present information in a seminar form and then offer one-to-one appointments to discuss individual issues. The primary focus will be on immigration questions, travel and welfare needs. People who wish to attend are required to preregister as space is limited and the sessions are expected to be popular because those held in Queenstown have been heavily subscribed.

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4. These workshops will have taken place by the date of the meeting and I hope to have some feedback available on the local up-take and response.

### **Minor Improvement Projects**

5. Earlier this year Board members provided feedback to staff on the list of Wānaka based minor improvement (roading) projects for the 2020/21 programme. This feedback has helped staff to determine the priority of projects and this updated list (Attachment A) is attached for the Board to note.

## Wānaka Lakefront Development Plan

- 6. The Board has received previous information about the various stages of this major development. Below is a brief update from the Parks and Reserves Team on the status of each stage.
- 7. The project team are working on the communication strategy and consultation plan for the Stage 2 design options which will shortly be presented to the community.
- 8. The Wanaka Lake Front Stage 3 design drawings have been submitted to the community for feedback. QLDC and Otago Regional Council consents for Stage 3 are currently being processed and procurement plans are being drafted.
- 9. The concept plans for Stages 4 and 5 are being finalised.

### **Wānaka Recreation Centre**

- 10. Wanaka Recreation Centre reopened under Alert Level 2 restrictions on Saturday 16 May and is now fully open under Level 1.
- 11. Programmes, classes and clubs have returned indoors including QLDC Swim School and Wanaka Swim Academy, Aquafit, adult and junior badminton, netball, basketball and floorball.
- 12. Hockey, athletics and football clubs are back training outdoors.
- 13. Council will run its normal school holiday programme at the end of Term 2.

## **Wanaka Community Board Drop-In Sessions**

- 14. Wanaka Community Board will relaunch its monthly Drop-In sessions from Wednesday, 1 July between 12.00pm and 1.00pm in the meeting room at the Wanaka Recreation Centre. Going forward, drop-in sessions are scheduled to happen on the first Wednesday of every month (except January) and once a regular pattern is established, it is planned to vary both their location and possibly, time of day.
- 15. The Council's communications team will promote the sessions in local media and on social media, the key messages being that no appointment is necessary, any problem, question,

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- complaint or even compliment is welcome and attendees will receive a warm welcome and a friendly ear as well as a hot drink and a biscuit.
- 16. I am very pleased that sessions will be supported by the Upper Clutha Liaison Manager and I am keen to set up a roster to ensure that we have a good representation from the Board at each session.

## **Upper Clutha Libraries**

- 17. All Upper Clutha Library staff worked from home during COVID-19 lockdown focusing on eServices and connecting with borrowers via phone, email and newsletter. As a result, eLending of eBooks and eAudio increased by 178% across the district during Level 4. A total of 7176 eResources were borrowed in April 2020, compared to 2577 during April 2019. Most popular online databases included PressReader (newspapers and magazines) (57,040 articles read during April) and Beamafilm (film streaming service) (861 films streamed in April). All eResources are free to users. All hard copy items issued pre-lockdown and unable to be returned to the libraries were renewed until 18 September 2020.
- 18. Hāwea, Makarora and Wānaka Libraries have been operating under Level 2 conditions and open to the public since 18 May 2020. Libraries have been generally quiet. On 9 June libraries returned to Level 1 and consequently public spaces have been opened up (previously restricted due to distancing requirements) and team members have stopped quarantining books (72 hours quarantine since 18 May), basically returning to normal operating conditions and usual hours, with sanitisation stations to remain.
- 19. My Book Bag was launched at Wānaka Library on 8 June and will be introduced at Frankton and Queenstown Libraries during June. This service offers home delivery to those members of the community who are vulnerable due to age, health, mobility or other factors. Library staff are currently proposing delivering library items during outreach visits to local retirement villages and schools. We are also proposing that volunteers assist with this service as we expand across the branches.
- 20. Meetings held during the week beginning 8 June with library team members and the Project Control Group discussed the Draft QLDC Library Strategy 2020-2030 and the implementation plan with the COVID-19 overlay.
- 21. Since opening on 8 June, Library staff at Hāwea and Wānaka Libraries have experienced an increase in numbers of library patrons who are scanning and printing government documents and CV's. New membership has also increased.
- 22. Staff are watching with interest for more details and parameters regarding the Government's \$60 million package for public libraries.

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## Liaison positions, community associations, and Council meeting updates

23. Members are invited to report on the Board-related activities they have been involved in since the previous meeting, and Councillors are asked to comment on any matters of interest from recent Council meetings.
