

This is the right direction. We need to aim to reduce landfill to the extent that we never need to commission a new landfill. It is not clear what actions will affect business generated wasted other than setting up a working group. This looks like a carrot, there also needs to be sticks and increasing the cost of disposing of waste, creating a reclamation yard and ensuring penalties for illegal disposal of waste are high enough. Hospitality generated food waste: what conditions are placed on private waste contractors who are using Victoria Flats landfill. Why can they not be obliged to use the composting facility? Can the red bins be phased out? They are too big and actively encourage people to create more waste? Or an option to have smaller red bins. Glass bins are too big- they are too heavy to move when they are full. Tourists create far more waste per person than ratepayers, a sliding scale for waste disposal whereby the less waste you produce the cheaper it is per unit and the more waste you create the cost per unit increases.

The focus of the waste management plan is on the collection of rates to pay for the plan, plus some input from waste fees. It assumes that the ratepayers are in the best position to reduce waste. No thought has been given to where waste originates or product desgn other than a brief mention of product stewardship. The rate payers are seen as the whole answer to waste reduction. This is not the case. The plan is greenwashing. No mention is made of the fees received by the Council for the waste collected and sold. The Government as a whole needs to address waste minimisation. Decisions made centrally affect all ratepayers throughout the country. There needs to be a focus of providing central leadership and services. No mention is made of the waste produced through poor decisions, whether roading, leaky buildings or incorrect specifications, etc.. Tourism is only mentioned three times in the report and yet tourism industry must be responsible for a large amount of waste. This should be payed for by the industry - not general ratepayers.

On behalf of Wastebusters, I would like to express our sincere appreciation for the considerable time and effort invested in developing this Draft Waste Management and Minimisation Plan. We particularly value being consulted prior to its development and welcome this further opportunity to provide feedback. Wastebusters fully supports the overarching direction of the plan.

About Wastebusters: A strategic partner in achieving zero waste

Wastebusters is a social enterprise with charitable status that has been a cornerstone of waste diversion and resource recovery in the Queenstown Lakes District for 25 years.

Our vision: Thriving communities and flourishing ecosystems protected by a zero waste, carbon neutral, circular economy.

Our purpose: Wastebusters exists to give our community a place to connect, learn and take action for the environment, before it's too late.

Our mission: We are a community enterprise leading the way to zero waste. We educate, engage and keep resources in circulation to accelerate behaviour change and environmental actions.

Our commitment aligns perfectly with the WMMP's vision of "Together Towards Zero Waste and a Circular Economy." We are a resilient, resourceful and strategic business, recognised locally and nationally for our zero waste leadership and impact.

Notably, at the 2024 Wānaka Business Excellence Awards, Wastebusters was honoured to be awarded the Supreme Business Award, in addition to winning the Business Sustainability & Environmental Impact Award, and the Community Contribution Award. These accolades underscore our proven expertise, skills, and experience in driving real change for our environment within our community and the wider district.

Our comprehensive approach and track record make us a vital and unique partner in achieving the WMMP's objectives across all streams of waste minimisation and sustained behaviour change.

Our mahi extends beyond simple waste minimisation. We actively foster a circular economy through resource recovery, innovative solutions, and our extensive behaviour change programmes. Dedicated to providing our community a place to connect, learn and take action for the environment, we champion a philosophy where "zero waste is just what we do here".

Wastebusters operates across business, industry, and the not-for-profit sector, while also an impactful resource recovery operator, and we believe our unique position should be accurately represented within the waste minimisation ecosystem. Given our pivotal role in our community and our proven ability to deliver on the plan's objectives, it is appropriate to recognise Wastebusters as an invaluable strategic partner and catalyst in bringing about a circular economy for our district.

The following are suggested actions the council could take to establish a long-term strategic partnership with Wastebusters:

Urgent space requirements to enable future impact

Over the 25 years that Wastebusters has operated from the same site on Ballantyne Road the population of the Wānaka-Upper Clutha area has grown dramatically from a population of 4,460 when we first opened, to 18,250 in 2024 - a 300% increase.

To continue our mahi and expand our impact in line with the district's growth and the ambitions of this WMMP, Wastebusters urgently requires additional, fit-for-purpose land.

With the increase in households, visitors, businesses and building projects we have run out of space to take all of the items that the community would like to donate to us and as a result quality reusable and recyclable products are ending up in landfill.

Our current site and parking areas, totalling 8,990 sqm, are significantly undersized, even before accounting for future population growth, or the scaling up or introduction of priority resource recovery activities.

We are currently operating with a shortfall of 2,520 sqm. The site constraints are actively preventing the maximisation of its impact in reducing waste to landfill. They act as a cap on waste diversion, a cap on revenue and threaten Wastebusters' financial viability.

Looking to the future, we see huge diversion potential in tackling waste timber, which accounts for a staggering 23% of all the waste dumped at the Wānaka transfer station. To incorporate new activities such as enhanced Construction & Demolition (C&D) waste sorting, processing, and retailing, our requirement for land is greater.

Providing a long-term lease for additional building-ready land at 189 Ballantyne Rd is critical to ensuring Wastebusters future viability, unlocking the potential diversion and achieving the goals of the WMMP.

Increasing the size of Wastebusters site to 32,230 sqm, would future-proof Wastebusters for the district's continued growth and deliver a projected diversion of 188,010 tonnes over the next 30 years.

Collaborating for change

In addition to Wastebusters being identified as a long-term, strategic partner, we strongly advocate for a dedicated section within the WMMP that articulates the actions council will take to support the for-purpose sector and other providers.

For example stronger collaboration across the for-purpose sector could be supported by council taking the following actions:

Overall feedback on the draft WMMP

We wholeheartedly support the objectives outlined in the WMMP and welcome the opportunity to provide further feedback on the actions in this submission.

We believe that by integrating the following suggestions, the plan can be strengthened to achieve even greater waste minimisation outcomes for the district.

There is an opportunity to strengthen the plan as a whole by cross referencing actions across objectives where appropriate, for example:

Objective 1 Reducing Construction Waste. Council Led Action #3 (Investigate the opportunities for improvement of construction waste diversion services and facilities) *to also appear* under Council led Actions in **Objective 3. Enhancing Waste Management and Minimisation Infrastructure.**

Checking Objective 1 Reducing Construction Waste. Council Led Action #2 (Develop regulatory tools to monitor and manage construction waste) is the same as Council led action #38 in Objective 5. Policy and Advocacy for Community Solutions.

Throughout the document, we suggest consistently pairing "waste minimisation" with "waste management" to drive a true focus on action at the top of the waste hierarchy, such as reduction and diversion, rather than just disposal. We would add "Repair" to the hierarchy, and note that there is an

opportunity for all sectors to feed into government policy through submissions and advocacy for positive action.

The plan would benefit from a dedicated discussion on reducing upstream waste from consumption, highlighting its significant impact and the necessity of addressing waste before it even enters the district. This goes beyond managing waste once it's created, to preventing it in the first place, aligning with the highest levels of the waste hierarchy.

While the plan includes behaviour change, we would strengthen this key action by reframing it to focus on "equipping our community with the tools they need to adopt new behaviours and making it easy for people to choose circular behaviours". This shifts the emphasis from telling people what to do to really enabling them, e.g, Wastebusters Resourceful Communities programmes like repair and low waste living that help make circular behaviours intuitive. Furthermore, it's crucial to clarify that information and education, while vital, are distinct from true behaviour change, which often requires deeper engagement, capability building and enabling infrastructure in addition to knowledge.

Regarding the portrayal of partnerships, particularly on pages 18-20, there's an opportunity to clearly differentiate between true collaborative partnerships and service level agreements.

We deeply value the Council's co-funding of the Resourceful Communities programme and our contracts for Enviroschools, Zero Waste Education, and Dr Compost, and believe this should be highlighted in the partnership section. We would suggest the following edit to the entry on page 19: "QLDC co-funds Wastebusters Resourceful Communities programme to engage, educate and inspire actions that help accelerate their work for a circular economy alongside Sustainable Queenstown in Whakatipu e.g. repair, slow fashion, low waste living. Wastebusters is also contracted to deliver Enviroschools and Zero Waste Education to schools, and the popular Dr Compost home composting project across the district."

We welcome the collaborative nature of this draft plan and suggest it recognise and foster the local ecosystem with language which is welcoming, collaborative and empowers all stakeholders through re-framing "how others can help" to "collaboration for change".

The business column should also include "construction" activities to fit better across all five objectives. This would give room for a dedicated column to reflect the contribution of industry sector groups, such as the business chambers, tourism groups and sector specific groups.

Measurement and targets

We welcome strong measurement, and suggest the overarching aim is updated to "Divert <u>or avoid</u> an additional 80,000 tonnes of waste from landfill over the six years".

We propose that the current diversion targets in the WMMP could be more ambitious and we suggest behaviour change is also measured by "evidence of people adopting new habits to reduce waste".

Wastebusters own impact directly influences the diversion statistics for our district, and we note for the 2023/24 financial year, we:

- diverted 1,410 tonnes of material through our repair, reuse and recycle activities
- engaged with 14,640 individuals through our various in-person programmes in schools, homes and businesses
- connected with 20,794 people online

With more space, enhanced infrastructure, and new activities at our proposed Wasties 2.0 Circular Economy and Environment hub, we estimate we could be diverting 4,050 tonnes per year at the current population size.

Objective 1: Reducing Construction Waste

This objective presents a crucial opportunity for significant waste diversion, given that construction and demolition (C&D) waste is the single biggest source of waste in our district. To achieve stronger integration and tangible results, we advocate for:

- Mandatory waste minimisation plans for all significant construction projects with embedded minimum standards. This would require developers to outline strategies for and report on material reuse, recycling and responsible disposal.
- Establishment of dedicated C&D resource recovery hubs. Wastebusters is primed to partner on this action, with our proposed hub in Wānaka we can establish a comprehensive C&D hub that enables sorting and recovery of building materials, diverting them from landfill into higher-value re-use. A similar hub in Queenstown is also essential.
- Incentivising reuse and recycling of C&D materials. This could involve offering reduced disposal fees for sorted loads or providing accreditation for projects that achieve high diversion rates.
- Stronger measurement and reporting. Implementing robust systems to track C&D waste streams, ensuring that initiatives are effective and identifying areas for further improvement.

Wastebusters, with its operational expertise and community connections, is uniquely positioned to partner with Council on these initiatives, actively contributing to the diversion of the plan's target of 52,000 tonnes. We expect 3,330 tonnes of C&D waste will be re-circulated back into our community in the first year of our new hub's operation, helping the district move higher up the waste hierarchy from simple disposal to reuse.

As a founding member of the Better Building Working Group, Wastebusters supports the group's submission and highlight designing out waste as integral action in successfully transitioning to a zero waste circular economy. We support their recommended actions for designing out waste, including:

- adding designing out waste to the WMMP as a high priority
- devising a plan of action for education and awareness campaigns
- ensuring that council building consent officers are not requiring over specification of products and materials when assessing consenting documents
- implementing designing out waste practices on any builds associated with QLDC

Objective 2: Reducing Organic Waste

Keeping organic waste out of landfill is a critical component of reducing greenhouse gas emissions and also improving soil health. Wastebusters wholeheartedly supports this objective and is already making contributions through our well-established programmes and involvement in this sector:

• the Dr Compost home composting project which has been helping residents home compost organics since 2007 engaged with 730 people across 20 workshops/events (2023/24 FY)

- our pilot project Compost Collect, established this year, which will work with businesses and events to compost food scraps
- the national Every Bite programme we helped co-designed and have delivered in the district for the past two years to help households reduce food waste
- and as founding member of the Wānaka Food Security Network which actively works to keep good food out of landfill

Objective 3: Enhancing Waste Management and Minimisation Infrastructure

A successful transition to zero waste fundamentally depends on fit-for-purpose resource recovery infrastructure. To ensure the WMMP drives impactful infrastructure development we recommend adding the following actions:

- New: Secure land for Wastebusters to expand their zero waste mahi: Wastebusters is dedicated to expanding our footprint to better serve our growing community. We envisage an exemplar circular economy hub, accommodating expanded resource recovery services in areas like C&D waste, repair, textiles recovery, and remakery workshops. This hub is crucial for future-proofing Wastebusters' financial model and enhancing our delivery of resource recovery, education, and engagement, serving as a vital piece of both waste and social infrastructure at no cost to Council.
- Enhance: Integrate "reverse logistics" to support reuse infrastructure: This is critical for preparing for and accelerating the shift to reusable packaging systems. Future-proofing facilities to manage the collection, cleaning, and redistribution of reusable packaging (e.g, for food and beverage) is essential for enabling scaling up, significantly reducing single-use packaging, landfill burden, and carbon emissions. Wastebusters could be an early adopter and operator of such systems.
- Enhance: Accelerate the implementation of a Container Return System (CRS): Wastebusters has
 the operational capacity and experience to implement a CRS rapidly, establishing a collection
 point and efficiently processing products. This system would provide accessible, incentivised
 recycling infrastructure, directly contributing to higher recovery rates of beverage containers and
 reducing litter and financially supporting recycling operations.
- Upgrade the Wānaka Transfer Station while aligning with the broader vision of also diverting materials.
- Explore the establishment of a community-led Circular Economy Hub for the Queenstown community.

Objective 4: Fostering Circular Economy Behaviours

This objective is at the heart of Wastebusters' mission, transforming community attitudes and practices towards resources. To make it more impactful we recommend the following inclusions/edits:

Edit: Invest in impactful programmes like Wastebusters' Resourceful Communities: This programme is specifically designed to engage, educate and inspire actions that accelerate a circular economy through practical solutions like repair, choosing reusables, and reducing packaging waste. We are helping to build a strong sense of community around zero waste, fostered through collaboration, meaningful connections, and practical actions, as demonstrated by the 1,260 people and 105 organisations involved in 22 in-person events (during the 2023/24 financial year).

• <u>Enhance:</u> Create and/or fund opportunities (e.g. infrastructure and systems) that make it easy for the community to participate in the circular economy. This includes providing accessible repair opportunities, promoting reusable packaging systems and supporting community reuse initiatives.

Objective 5: Policy and Advocacy for Community Solutions

This objective provides the framework for strategic, district-wide change that transcends operational activities. To strengthen it we recommend adding:

- Explore alternative funding models for litter reduction and recycling: The WMMP should investigate how initiatives like a Container Return System could contribute financially to broader litter reduction efforts and the maintenance of recycling infrastructure.
- Implement minimum waste minimisation and diversion and reporting standards for event organisers: To ensure consistent and impactful waste minimisation, the Council should introduce clear, enforceable minimum diversion standards that all event organisers in the district must meet. This would require robust waste minimisation plans for events, moving beyond voluntary measures. Wastebusters is well-equipped to undertake comprehensive waste audits, providing granular data and insights to inform evidence-based policy development and track progress effectively.
- Advocate nationally for extended producer responsibility (EPR) schemes: The WMMP should clearly state the Council's commitment to advocating for national EPR schemes that place responsibility on producers for the end-of-life management of their products, reducing the burden on local ratepayers.
- Advocate for policies that mandate or incentivise reusable packaging across all sectors so that we can move beyond single-use alternatives.
- Provide strong policy support for a Container Return System (CRS): This could include actively supporting consent processes for new drop-off points in public spaces.

In closing

We are confident that with a truly collaborative approach, leveraging Wastebusters' expertise and the community's strong support, Queenstown Lakes can achieve its ambitious zero-waste and circular economy goals. We look forward to continuing to work collaboratively with the Council to bring the vision of zero carbon communities, with zero waste "just what we do here," to reality.

We can't reduce the amount of egg shells, vege peels, coffee grinds, mussel shells etc that are unavboidable bi-products of our food service industry, so we need to be able to dispose of these regulalry in a responsible manner that also maintains the current quality of our operating environments - stinky waste storage areas will result in neglegance of these facilities as people won't want to avoid or care for them as they don't want to spend time in these areas, they will dump and run. Thank you,

I suggest the following changes or additions:

Page 4 of draft: "reasons for this" list: add the capacity of landfills with data on that.

I thank you for the data on waste audit and landfill content.

I didn't realise the building industry was so polluting. It must be addressed promptly and doesn't look difficult. Talk directly with the building companies so they take their responsibility; help them to adapt to zero waste with a landfill polluter pays fee, also acting as a deterrent. This kind of cause/consequences campaign works well in various behaviour change experiences (example: bikes in Paris).

I am blown away by the data of compostable and recyclable items found in landfill bins. People need a campaign to take responsibility (see below Behaviour change campaign)

Page 31 (of full report): Add businesses can help by "sending unused food to the community food rescue"

Page 32 "Frankton recovery facility needs replacement " this needs a few more details as it probably won't be cheap.

How old is the system? Who installed it? What's wrong with it? Can't it be fixed or upgraded? How much will it cost in either case?

Page 38

Add refill stations map, common in Bali.

Page 44

Fees and charges need more detail. At the moment we are charged for wheelie bins whether we use them or not. We put them out less than 10 times per year and get to pay as much as a full wheelie bin out each week. This is not an incentive to reduce rubbish.

Please consider applying the Polluter Pays Principle, ideally charging the actual costs to deal with the pollution.

It is easy in the case of wheelie bins: they can be chipped and record the info automatically each time the truck picks them up.

It is an incentive to immediately reduce the rubbish you buy and bin.

Page 46 "kerbside rubbish collection" monitoring report will include the actual data from the wheelie bin chip recorded at each download in the truck.

Page 45-48 Add a goal in each of the Monitoring progress lines.

Behaviour change campaign

To create a necessary immediate and fun culture shift, add a page to engage and start the behaviour change.

List and detail all the things people can /should do, from compost workshops to sorting correctly... Start fun campaigns (exemples below)

Focus on reduce, avoid, no waste step.

Recycling and reuse have been championed by waste busters for years Repair is starting but **reduce** is still shy. "Reduce" means not buying in the first place, a deeper change often perceived as interfering with personal life and business. Yet essential!

"Say no to packaging" campaign with heros, stories, stickers, bags, placards, tips competition, maps of participating businesses...

Reducing packaging is closely linked to local and homemade sources, to be promoted (see film industry opportunity).

Everything is connected and **local food** is central to reducing food packaging, also healthy, low carbon, community wellbeing, great education opportunities, affordability, and closing the food waste/compost loop. Waste reduction could team up with climate, resilience and blue-green corridor to **enable local food**: Develop community gardens, garden plots, market gardens, community orchards or cows... We need land close to residential areas and land still unused needs urgent protection before being built up with houses. Create land rules or MOU that encourages landowners to dedicate a part of their land to commons. Local food creates the low carbon lifestyle depicted on page 2.

Film industry opportunity

Create change in the district and beyond with documentaries, TV reality, How-to,

Example TV game: teams of 2 to 4 households, some advanced some novice; record waste, carbon, circular, local practice.

Then teams work together to improve their footprint. Then we measure again for win.

Exemple: daily TV game where people send videos with tips on every theme. A jury discuss and choose the best ones, people choice, prizes.

Submission: Queenstown Lakes Waste Minimisation and Management Plan 2025-2031

Thank you for the opportunity for Destination Queenstown (DQ) and Lake Wānaka Tourism (LWT) to provide feedback on the Queenstown Lakes Waste Minimisation and Management Plan (WMMP) 2025–2031.

The strategic direction outlined in the WMMP closely aligns with the Queenstown Lakes Destination Management Plan (DMP) – *Travel to a Thriving Future* – a partnership between QLDC, DQ and LWT focused on achieving a regenerative visitor economy by 2030.

The DMP's keystone project – to reach a carbon zero visitor economy by 2030 – cannot be achieved without addressing waste as a systemic contributor to emissions and environmental degradation. The WMMP supports this ambition through:

- A shared focus on reducing waste to landfill and maximising diversion
- Recognition of behaviour change and education as critical enablers
- Opportunities to advance circular economy practices through procurement and infrastructure
- Integration with other key council strategies

We are encouraged to see acknowledgement of tourism's contribution to the district's waste profile and seasonal pressures, and welcome further collaboration on this. To strengthen implementation and alignment with the DMP, we respectfully submit the following recommendations:

- Explicitly reference the Destination Management Plan (DMP) as a complementary strategy that supports shared outcomes around waste minimisation, emissions reduction, and circular economy transformation.
- Include tourism-specific actions by collaborating with Destination Queenstown and Lake Wānaka Tourism to co-design waste reduction strategies tailored for accommodation, hospitality, activities, and events.
- Improve visibility of tourism-related waste through co-developed methodologies that allow better attribution of waste from the visitor economy, helping to inform policy, reporting, and future planning.
- Align visitor-facing infrastructure and education (e.g. signage, bins, waste stations) with regenerative tourism messaging and the Tiaki Promise, embedding waste awareness into the visitor experience.

As one of QLDC's delivery partners of the DMP, DQ and LWT remain committed to implementing waste projects in line with the DMP and zero waste. We look forward to continued collaboration to enable shared outcomes, support business capability, and help Queenstown Lakes transition to a low-waste, high-value future.


Background

- 1. The Queenstown Lakes District Council (QLDC) is seeking public submissions on its Waste Management and Minimisation Plan (WMMP) consultation. QLCHT wishes to submit in support of the WMMP and provide further suggestions for consideration.
- 2. This submission focuses on the Rethink and Reduce elements of the waste hierarchy system with regard to construction waste management (also known as designing out waste). These inspirational elements need visionary thought processes and solutions to enable, not necessarily detailed actions. Our suggestions should make it simpler and easier for QLDC to implement and capture the great potential of Rethink and Reduce.
- 3. The proposed WMMP clearly puts Rethink and Reduce at the top of the waste minimisation hierarchy. However, few of the existing, enhanced and new actions currently address this top part of the hierarchy. Given that Rethink and Reduce are what generates the biggest impact on construction waste minimisation, we must not only give this the highest priority, but also have a very simple and practical action plan for implementation.
- 4. Concept design is where 20% effort can unlock 80% potential. The time in the concept stage is t limited, and that's why we need to be laser focused on designing smarter, simpler and smaller. Huge impact can be achieved if we ask these questions during the planning and concept stages.
- 5. The impact from this stage will not be measurable until much later in the process. Often, there is no visible outcome to be seen. This may feel counter intuitive, however we need to resist the temptation to jump into details too soon.
- 6. When QLDC collaborates with the construction industry or funds educational events, it could prioritize parties that promote design-out waste solutions that are smarter, simpler, and smaller. Conversely, QLDC should de-prioritize parties that offer overly complex, oversized solutions.

QLCHT Submission

- 1. Incorporate new thought processes and solutions into the WMMP, including the following:
 - a. Smarter design for the optimal use and timelessness to fundamentally minimise the need for retrofit, maintenance and demolition.
 - b. Simpler design for efficient construction to form the foundation for simpler project management, construction management, cost management and waste management.
 - c. Smaller design for fundamental reduction on the resources required without compromise on people and/or construction.
- 2. Incorporate a focus on efficient construction rather than deconstruction.
- 3. Incorporate a focus on designing for best use first, rather than reuse.
- 4. Incorporate a focus for minimum use of resources first, rather than waste minimisation.
- 5. Add the following considerations to the Reducing Construction Waste actions:



Smarter, simpler and smaller design solutions are the foundation of designing out waste, while keeping everything easier, faster, actionable and realistic in the real world.

WAO BETTER EVENTS COLLECTIVE FEEDBACK

Summary

The Wao Better Events Collective welcomes the development of the Waste Management and Minimisation Plan (WMMP) and values the opportunity to provide feedback.

We view this plan as a vital step toward embedding long-term waste minimisation and management principles within the event sector—spanning cultural, corporate, private and community-led events.

We commend the Council's emphasis on partnership and collaboration. For the WMMP to be truly effective, event-related policies must be integrated into broader systemic change and aligned with existing community and business-led sustainability initiatives. Events should not be treated in isolation but recognised as part of the wider ecosystem influencing waste outcomes.

We recommend more explicit integration of sustainable event practices within Objectives 2–5 of the plan as outlined below, positioning events as a key pillar within the business sector. Events are significant regional drivers, attracting attendees who often extend their visits and contribute to the local economy through spending across hospitality, retail, and other services. This is particularly true for events that attract international attendees given New Zealand's isolated geographic location.

Accelerating Action Through Partnerships (pg 22) GAP/OPPORTUNITY

Recognise events as a key stakeholder in the business sector

Objective Two: Reducing Organic Waste (pg 30) GAP/OPPORTUNITY

BEC members are committed to waste reduction and diversion practices, however there continues to be significant barriers to achieving their waste related goals, particularly with regards to organic food waste and a lack of collection services.

- Ref 7: Households have access to an organic waste collection service.
 - Expand to include business/venues/events
 - Work with venues/wedding planners for green waste collection
 - Support a pilot programme in Wānaka similar to Queenstown's 'Waste to Wilderness'

- Start education/communication campaigns with venues/events organisers in the second half of 2025 and early 2026, so there is a seamless rollout once the commercial composting facility comes online
- Ref 10: Support Food Rescue
 - Expand to include food rescue from events. Work with local event/wedding planners/caterings - clients can choose to donate food in advance to a list of causes
 - Any food that can be eaten picked up/distributed to local food banks
 - Second tier leftovers sent to groups like Food for Love/Baskets of Blessings and turned into meals - remainder composted
- ADD: Promote and support initiatives to reduce event waste (Similar to C&D waste)
 - Council will work with the events sector and stakeholders to develop and promote best practice tools, resources and initiatives to reduce waste. Groups such as the Wao Better Events Collective (BEC) and Wastebusters have a key role in driving change and influencing the sector
 - Can we include reference to the Better Events Collective. Logos can be downloaded <u>here</u> and member logos <u>here</u>
 - Partner with BEC to develop a Sustainability Charter for local events, which would establish clear standards surrounding waste minimisation and management. This approach fosters a more open and constructive environment.
- ADD: Support monitoring and data collection on event waste
 - A major roadblock for Better Events Collective members and event organisers is the lack of accessible, event-specific waste data. To drive meaningful improvements, we must first be able to measure current performance—establishing a clear baseline is essential. Without consistent data collection, it is difficult to identify areas for improvement or to track progress over time. We strongly recommend that the Council support events in collecting and analysing waste data as a foundational step. This will enable the development of informed strategies, create accountability, and help incentivise the shift toward lower-impact event models.

Objective Three: Enhancing Waste Management and Minimisation Infrastructure GAP/OPPORTUNITY

- Ref 19: Provide collection points for materials that are difficult to recycle or recover
 - Run an education/awareness campaign surrounding the danger of vapes causing fires in landfills - tie this into events where vapes pens are prevalent (Beerfest, R&A etc)
- Ref 24: Support reuse infrastructure opportunities

 Expand to incorporate reuse infrastructure opportunities specific to events. Support a pilot study examining an opportunity for the whole of Wānaka to use a circular re-use system (for events and local cafes)
 current study being undertaken by CCC

Objective Four: Fostering Circular Economy Behaviours GAP/OPPORTUNITY

- Ref 29: Enable reusable schemes
 - We encourage the Council to enable and support reusable systems, with a particular focus on incorporating events as key trial environments. Events create temporary but concentrated demand on local waste infrastructure, making them ideal pilot settings for circular economy initiatives. They offer a real-time opportunity to test, refine, and evaluate reusable schemes before scaling them more broadly.
 - To maximise this potential, we recommend partnering with or incentivising event organisers to implement circular solutions and to collect relevant waste-related data. For instance, supporting the installation of reusable keg systems at high-use venues such as popular wedding locations could significantly reduce single-use beverage container waste. Targeted interventions like these can provide measurable outcomes and showcase practical, scalable models for waste reduction.

Objective Five: Policy and Advocacy for Community Solutions GAP/OPPORTUNITY

- Ref 41: Support business' with research and waste audit opportunities
 - We recommend that locally run events—beyond just those directly supported or hosted by Council—be actively included in research, data collection, and waste minimisation initiatives. Events offer a valuable, contained environment to observe attendee behaviour, pilot new waste-reduction strategies, and gather insights that can inform broader business and community waste solutions as evidenced by the new initiatives at the A&P this year. By leveraging the diversity of event types and scales, Council can better understand real-world applications and identify scalable opportunities for impact across the business sector.
 - Ref 42: Advocate on behalf of the community for extended product stewardship
 - Add advocacy for regulations surrounding greenwashing particularly surrounding compostable and recycled packaging

Sustainable Queenstown supports the direction and intent of the Draft Waste Management and Minimisation Plan (WMMP) 2025–2031.

The vision of transitioning towards zero waste and a circular economy is bold, timely, and deeply aligned with the values we see in our local community. We're particularly supportive of the WMMP's commitment to behaviour change, infrastructure that enables reuse, and stronger collaboration with community organisations.

We wish to highlight the following areas where the WMMP intersects meaningfully with our work, and where we see the greatest opportunity for impact:

Reuse Systems and Low-Waste Events (Actions 28 & 29)

We strongly support the proposed actions to develop community reuse schemes and support zero waste event initiatives.

Through our work with events, vendors and local organisers, we've seen firsthand how enabling systems (such as reusable serveware, consistent messaging, and bin station volunteers) can reduce waste to landfill and increase community awareness.

There is a strong appetite for a framework and investment in infrastructure that makes reuse the default, not the exception.

Behaviour Change and Community Education (Objective 4, Actions 30–33)

We fully endorse the emphasis on education and behaviour change as a critical lever for long-term impact.

From conversations at our events and workshops, it's clear that residents want to do more but often feel confused, under-equipped, or it's simply 'too hard'. Consistent messaging, shared frameworks, and localised education is a key component to make waste minimisation more accessible and actionable.

We encourage continued support for trusted local delivery partners to activate and engage communities in ways council-led campaigns can't always reach.

Repair, Reuse and Community-Led Initiatives (Objective 5)

The WMMP's recognition of the role of grassroots and community-led initiatives is vital.

In collaboration with Wastebusters through the Resourceful Communities programme, we deliver repair cafés, low-waste living workshops, and Plastic Free July activations. These events not only reduce waste but create social connection and local resilience.

We're pleased to see repair and reuse recognised as strategic tools, not just fringe activities, and we support investment in expanding this kaupapa.

Enabling Collaboration and Long-Term Partnership (Action 37)

We strongly support the plan's commitment to partner with community organisations to achieve shared outcomes.

Community partners often work with limited resources but can engage quickly, locally, and with strong public trust. We encourage the council to continue to build stable, long-term relationships with organisations already delivering in this space, and to treat them as collaborators, not contractors.

Final Comments

This plan is a crucial step toward a more circular, resilient, and community-led approach to waste. We support its adoption and look forward to working alongside QLDC to bring its vision to life.

INTRODUCTION

Wao Aotearoa, is a registered charity under the name One New Zealand Charitable Trust (Wao), based in the Southern Lakes. The mission of the trust is to inspire, educate and enable communities to live in balance within a thriving, sustainable and diverse ecosystem. The board, team and volunteers bring a range of expertise in greenhouse gas (GHG) accounting, employment, circular economy, behaviour change, health and construction. This is a submission from the group.

The Better Building Working Group (BBWG) is a multi-disciplinary working group facilitated and supported by Wao. It was established in 2018 and is composed of representatives from the building ecosystem including engineers, architects, builders, tradies, developers, suppliers, waste management services, local and regional councils and community experts. The group takes a holistic approach to improving the building industry in the Southern Lakes. The current key focus areas of the group are: building climate smart communities, reducing the carbon footprint of the built environment, reducing C&D waste to landfill and eliminating toxicity in building.

SUMMARY

This submission is aimed specifically at the points relevant to Construction and Demolition (C&D) waste within QLDC's draft Waste Management and Minimisation Plan (WMMP). The draft plan specifically sets out to "divert additional 52,000 tonnes of construction waste" over the next six years.

The BBWG supporting members commend QLDC for outlining significant targets to addressing one of the industry's most glaring issues. C&D waste is much more significant than previously thought, as outlined in the Ministry for the Environment's recently commissioned report "New Zealand Construction and Demolition Waste Baseline & Tracking Methodology Report".

More locally, the recent <u>Queenstown-Lakes District waste audit</u> puts C&D waste at 34% of all waste, or about 309 tonnes per week. This is calculated as the largest source of waste in the district.

While we agree with and support QLDC in its efforts outlined toward C&D waste in the draft WMMP, this submission outlines areas where we believe the WMMP can be added to or improved.

1. RE-THINK AND REDUCE - Design and Pre-build planning

The best opportunity to reduce, and remove unnecessary waste from the building industry is to not create it in the first place.

In addition to on the ground diversion practices, it is imperative that waste minimisation efforts also look at concepts such as material specifications, build standardisations, procurement and contract implementations, materials ordering practices, and designing out waste among many other practices not associated with on the ground building.

As such, the WMMP would greatly benefit from a dedicated discussion on upstream C&D waste. Something that is currently lacking in the WMMP. Some of these upstream C&D waste issues facing the industry on a global scale include overspecifying, over-ordering, and design practices that cause additional waste. These issues highlight the significant impact that initial planning stages of a build present in generating C&D waste and the necessity of addressing waste before it even enters the district. This goes beyond managing waste once it's created, to preventing it in the first place, aligning with the highest levels of the waste hierarchy.

Additional topics such as feedback loops, procurement and contract expectations, early contractor consultations, early stage waste assessments, design for disassembly, flexible and adaptable designs along with design consultation opportunities could all go a long way in assisting waste minimisation efforts.

A. DESIGNING OUT WASTE

The draft WMMP, while positively addressing multiple points of the waste hierarchy within the construction industry, fails to address a key concept - designing out waste.

One BBWG member and company has recently conducted a full waste audit study on a large Queenstown-based commercial build. The plethora of findings were extremely insightful.

However, likely the most impactful piece of information from the study showed that 80% of the generated waste could have been reduced at the design stage.

While we are aware that tackling the concept of designing out waste is not easy to address, the potential for successful results is too large to ignore.

It is strongly encouraged and highly recommended that the WMMP address this point.

The concept of designing out waste can be addressed through the following 5 points:

- Design for waste-efficient procurement
- Design for materials optimisation
- Design for off-site construction
- Design for reuse and recovery
- Design for deconstruction and flexibility

While council can not be expected to enforce the concept of designing out waste onto private enterprise, there are steps QLDC can take to encourage the concept, including the following

- Education and awareness campaigns;
- Collaborate with local industry to better understand designing out waste and how to implement it;
- Support for the <u>eco design advisor service</u> (such as other districts implement);
- Ensure that the council building consent officers are not requiring over specification of products and materials when assessing consenting documents;
- Utilise designing out waste concepts on any ongoing or future QLDC build, construction, or demolition projects;
- Ensure that any business conducting work on behalf of, for, or in any capacity with QLDC utilise designing out waste practices.
- Collect C&D waste data associated with any QLDC projects to better understand impacts of waste minimisation practices to help inform future policy settings.
- Support Materials with recycled content.
- Seek to reduce superfluous Material consumption, are materials required here at all.

RECOMMENDATION: We Recommend that QLDC include in the 2025-2031 WMMP:

- That designing out waste not only be added to the WMMP, but that it also be given high priority;
- 2. Implement a plan of action for education and awareness campaigns around designing out waste;

- Ensure that the council building consent officers are not requiring over specification of products and materials when assessing consenting documents;
- 4. Implement designing out waste practices on any builds, construction, or demolition projects associated with QLDC and Property Management (large firms like Westwood);
- 5. Investigate and allow for potential support for a QLD Eco Design Advisor;
- Collect C&D waste data associated with any QLDC projects to better understand impacts of waste minimisation practices to help inform future policy settings;
- 7. Consider review of the amount of renovations due to tenancy turn over within the district within short term leases and the amount of waste;
- 8. Implement best practice on de-construction to optimise material re-use and diversion from landfill;
- 9. Provide actionable solutions for clients, design teams and contractors to set project waste reduction targets during design and construction;
- 10. Aid in efforts to allow design teams to share their learnings and best practice on designing out waste within their practices and externally through their networks;
- 11. Implementation of case studies on how designing out waste has been considered within the design process and what changed as a result;
- 12. Ensure design teams undertake material optimisation through design choices and material selection working with manufacturers.
- 13. Professional Institutions and universities and colleges include designing out waste in training, CPD and academic courses.

B. Design For Disassembly and Adaptability

New Build – ensure new buildings and structures use resources efficiently, are designed for durability and longevity and safety, and are designed for deconstruction and disassembly at end of life.

Existing Buildings – most of the buildings and structures we will use in the future already exist today, so at end of their current use can they be repurposed for new uses, and if not can they be demolished in a way to ensure the maximum amount of product and material is reused, recycled or recovered.

RECOMMENDATION: We support:

- 1. Closed-loop systems Minimize waste by ensuring materials stay in continuous use through recycling and repurposing.
- 2. Low-carbon & regenerative design Use passive design, renewable energy, and nature-based solutions.
- 3. Product-as-a-service models Leasing materials (e.g., carpet tiles, lighting systems) instead of owning them. ***QLDC to consider for short term lease holders such as CBD retailers. Work with local property managers such as Westwood etc to set up service offerings to reduce waste in renovations between tenants.
- 4. Phase in Life Cycle Assessments to consent documentation design and construction phases.

Key Skills & Knowledge Areas (for architects, policy and local governments)

- 1. Material sourcing & specification Understanding material passports, Environmental Product Declarations (EPDs), and New Zealand-based reclaimed material suppliers.
- 2. Lifecycle assessment (LCA) Evaluating embodied carbon and overall environmental impact.
- 3. Modular & prefabricated design Techniques that allow for flexibility, disassembly, and reuse.
- 4. Policy & certification frameworks Familiarity with Green Star NZ, Living Building Challenge, and New Zealand's Waste Minimisation Act.
- 5. Stakeholder collaboration Working with councils, suppliers, and clients to implement circular strategies.

Manufacturers & Suppliers

- 1. Manufacturers and contractors collaborate to implement reusable packaging schemes. Ban plastic that cannot be recycled.
- 2. Masterspec eCert, EPDs

2. MATERIAL REUSE & CIRCULARITY - Diversion

Following down the waste hierarchy, before even touching recycling, we need to consider reuse practices. According to the draft WMMP, over 67% of all waste currently going to landfill can be diverted. And while recycling and waste management companies will have their part to play, reuse practices should first be considered and hold a higher priority.

A. Diversion Hubs - regional (Wanaka, Queenstown, Cromwell, Alexandra)

We see a strong need for C&D resource recovery hubs across the district. There are currently no C&D hubs operating in our district at the scale required to make a significant contribution to the proposed WMMP target of diverting 52,000 tonnes of C&D waste over 6 years.

C&D hubs are essential waste minimisation infrastructure. They would make a significant impact on the large volume of waste to landfill every week and achievement of WMMP goals. There is huge diversion potential in tackling waste timber in particular.

Wānaka C&D Hub

Wānaka transfer station timber accounts for a staggering 23% of all waste received. With a C&D hub, capable of sorting, separating, processing and retailing large volumes of timber and cleanfill, Wastebusters estimate they could be diverting 50% of the 3,330 tonnes of timber and cleanfill dumped at the Wānaka transfer station each year.

Wastebusters is primed to partner on this action. The BBWG are aware that Wastebusters are in discussions with QLDC seeking the Council's in principle support to expand their current site at Ballantyne Road and are progressing funding applications with the Ministry for the Environment and other funders to raise the capital required.

The BBWG whole-heartedly supports Wastebusters request for Council to provide Wastebusters with a significantly expanded site at 189 Ballantyne Rd, enabling them to set up and operate a C&D hub at significant scale.

The Council's commitment to provide Wastebusters with more land is critical for:

- Delivering on the proposed WMMP goal of diverting an additional 52,000 tonnes of C&D waste from landfill over the next 6 years.
- Unlocking multi-million dollar, external funding (from the Ministry for the Environment's Waste Minimisation Fund and other funders) to fund the capital development required.

Additional District-Wide C&D Hubs

Wastebusters in Wānaka has proven the exceptional value resource recovery sites can provide. However, with a larger portion of C&D waste coming from outside of Wānaka, it's imperative that additional C&D diversion hubs be considered, as it is not realistic for Wastebusters to serve the entire district.

It's been made clear that without proper reuse opportunities such as physical land, storage space appropriate with weather protection, and potential opportunities such as virtual stores and marketplaces the "REUSE" side of diversion is staged to fail.

A circular economy means a new approach to waste infrastructure, and the supporting members of this submission strongly believe that QLDC should include language in the WMMP to support such infrastructure. We believe that the council could strategically invest in the district's waste minimisation infrastructure around resource recovery centers with profound long-term returns.

We are aware that Naylor Love established a <u>resource sorting station</u> in Queenstown, with support from QLDC, to facilitate the recycling, reuse, and donation of materials. This initiative aims to make reusable materials available to local schools, community groups, and the public for DIY projects, thereby diverting construction waste from landfills. However, further measures must be taken to improve C&D resource recovery in places like Queenstown.

RECOMMENDATION: We recommend:

- Establishment of dedicated C&D resource recovery hubs across the district
 - a. Wastebusters is primed to partner on this action in Wānaka and we urge Council to provide Wastebusters with the land required.
 - b. A similar hub in Queenstown is also essential.
- 2. Incentivising reuse and recycling of C&D materials: This could involve offering reduced disposal fees for sorted loads or providing accreditation for projects that achieve high diversion rates.
 - a. Set a Target to reuse and recycle discarded soil and concrete.
 - b. Goal aiming for (%) Goal Met? (Y/N)
- 3. Stronger measurement and reporting: Implementing robust systems to track C&D waste streams, ensuring that initiatives are effective and identifying areas for further improvement.
- 4. Material life cycle & reuse Prioritize salvaged, recycled, and renewable materials. Review consenting and alternative solution options. (reused timber flooring)
- 5. Establish pilot programs for the physical and digital infrastructure to reuse materials/existing building stock, working closely with industry partners to enhance marketplace development.
- 6. Expand requirements for deconstruction plans and reuse assessments for existing buildings and large renovation projects
- 7. Provide incentives (e.g. financial) for the research and development of specific diversion goals, deconstruction ordinances, and approaches to design for deconstruction
- 8. Evaluate the economic and regulatory barriers to adaptive reuse in compliance with zoning, energy codes, and landmarks requirements

3. RECYCLE / RECOVER

A. Site Waste Minimisation Plans (SWMPs)

In 2025, the New Zealand government was expected to implement a series of new building legislation under what is called "Building for Climate Change". The construction industry anticipated new rules around carbon emissions and climate resilient building.

One of the new measures the industry was preparing for was a staged implementation of compulsory Site Waste Minimisation Plans (SWMPs) for all new buildings, renovations and demolitions/deconstructions.

However, the start of 2025 has come and gone, and no new rules around SWMPs have emerged.

While any industry is frequently opposed to any change or new mandatory ways of working, legislation such as compulsory SWMPs would go a long way to help tackle one of the largest issues facing the construction industry nationwide.

A recent study on <u>Construction & Demolition (C&D) waste in New Zealand</u>, put forward by the Waste Management Institute of New Zealand (WasteMINZ), shows that overall C&D waste estimates are nearly 20% higher than previously thought, at about 69.4% of all waste nationwide.

Here in the Queenstown Lakes District, C&D waste remains the highest source of waste, albeit coming in at 34% of all waste. Regardless of the fact that the QLDC's proportion of C&D waste is much lower than that of nationwide measures doesn't mean we shouldn't still focus our efforts on doing everything we can to help reduce it.

Without compulsory SWMPs, it is likely that many local builders will continue to disregard diversion practices.

While many members of the BBWG are committed to waste reduction and diversion practices, there continue to be significant barriers to achieving their waste related goals. On site sub-contractors frequently seem to be a concern, in that there seems to be a level of frequency that sub-contractors do not follow company diversion practices. Furthermore, while most teams like to think that their own employees are following practices outlined by the company, this also seems to be of concern.

The following is a submission from a BBWG member, working for a well-known and prevalent building company across the Southern Lakes region and beyond:

"In the 4.5 years I've been consulting to this company we have created processes, targets, resources and education around on-site waste management. We are tracking waste contractors' monthly reporting for site and overall recycling and landfill waste; and with stagnating progress in reducing landfill waste we decided to do some surprise on site waste checks.

Our findings were that employees on site were failing in the company's expectations to correctly recycle the basics- cardboard, soft plastic, polystyrene, aib.

In order to meet the goal of reducing construction waste, policy will absolutely need to be required at the Building Consent Stage. A council building inspector could use 5 minutes of his time when coming to do building inspections to ensure that recycling bins are present and being used. No bins=no tick."

The members of the BBWG who support this submission agree that compulsory SWMPs would go a long way to meeting the desired C&D waste reduction goals outlined in QLDC's draft WMMP. In fact, we believe that it will be very difficult to meet those goals without such implementation.

As such, we strongly recommend that language towards compulsory SWMPs be included in the council's WMMP. Our district can not afford to wait another 6 years to even consider such implementation.

At a recent visit of Victoria's Flat Landfill, members of the BBWG witnessed the landfill operators provide an estimated year of closure between 2050-2055. With C&D being the largest source of waste to Victoria Flats, SWMPs would significantly assist with extending the landfill's lifetime.

Many believe that mandatory SWMPs will come sooner or later from the national government. However, in the meantime, QLDC should follow the steps of other councils around the country in implementing bylaws around SWMPs.

In 2022, AUT issued a report titled <u>"Mandatory Site Waste Management Plans"</u>. At the bottom of page 7, reads:

"Auckland Council can minimise risk by learning from the experiences of Hamilton City Council and New Plymouth District Council both of whom have implemented bylaws mandating site waste management plans within the past 2 years. In addition, the experiences of cities like San Francisco and Rotterdam, which have long-running programmes, provide invaluable learnings.

Critical success factors for Auckland have been identified. These factors include:

- A council-led programme (already achieved);
- Stakeholder consultation (in progress);
- Mandating site waste management plans through a bylaw;
- A staggered implementation starting with large projects and gradually filtering down to smaller and smaller developments;
- The Council providing tools, guides, information, assistance and a template process;
- Minimising bureaucratic requirements through an online data collection system;
- Engagement by the Council with the waste and construction industries during development to provide a system that is easy to implement and workable;
- A programme of monitoring, auditing and enforcement needs to be developed; and
- Work with other Councils to aid reproducibility and standardisation (with minor changes for localisation) across the country.

In conclusion, a programme to develop and implement mandatory site waste management plans is feasible, desirable and will work to reduce construction and demolition waste across the city. A programme will also enable the Council and the construction sector to gain valuable information on waste quantities and flow."

The supporters of this submission recommend following similar steps.

RECOMMENDATIONS: We Recommend that QLDC include in the 2025-2031 WMMP:

- 1. Specific language and action around SWMPs;
- 2. Conduct, if not yet already done, research on existing SWMP bylaws in other NZ districts; Refer Resources (links)..
- Review other relevant studies, such as that of the aforementioned AUT "Mandatory Site Waste Management Plans" Report;
- 4. Produce a report on the above two points relevant to the Queenstown-Lakes District, including potential risks, areas of improvement, and important points of regional difference;
- 5. Implementation of a pilot program, with a duration of no more than 1 year;
- 6. Depending on the outcomes of all above points, consider rolling out staged implementation of mandatory SWMPs;
- 7. Provide district wide information on all of the above;

- 8. QLDC to strengthen advocacy and lobbying to central government for implementing policy settings which will enable increased diversion and recycling of materials from C&D sites. eg. nationwide plasterboard collection; and
- 9. Review NZ Certifications guidance, Living Building Challenge, Greenstar and Homestar, as well as LEED to assist with measuring and setting waste targets.

4. Behaviour Change, Education, Engagement, Policy

One common theme that arises on site around diversion and recycling is lack of education about what, how and where materials can be diverted and recycled.

While the plan includes behaviour change, we would strengthen this key action by reframing it to focus on "equipping people with the tools they need to adopt new behaviours and making it easy to choose circular behaviours". It's crucial to clarify that information and education, while vital, are distinct from true behaviour change, which requires deeper engagement, capability building and enabling infrastructure. This would shift the emphasis from telling people what to do, to really enabling them by making circular actions more visible, desirable and achievable.

Any action which is implemented in the above sections will likely require the support of a behaviour change and education campaign to connect with the sector and lock in the 'why'. This critical component of change is known to require a long term approach, so QLDC should clearly outline how they intend to develop, strengthen and enable long-term behaviour change for the sector.

For example, QLDC could play a very active role in education with the local waste management companies to educate sites on easy ways to recycle. There are a number of easy ways to start a recycling program on sites which includes cardboard, plastic, polystyrene and metal. This could be assisted by QLDC to builders to educate and make it easy and accessible.

Furthermore, existing local enterprises such as Wastebusters can be well placed to take a lead role in delivering the hands-on training required to support waste reduction efforts e.g. separation of materials for recycling and reuse and maximise the tonnage of material recovered through C&D hubs.

RECOMMENDATIONS: We recommend:

1. QLDC clearly outline how they intend to develop, strengthen and enable long-term behaviour change for the sector

- 2. Funding from the community QAC, QLDC
- 3. QLDC engage with local waste management companies to help the industry with diversion practices such as recycling.
- 4. QLDC work with local enterprises to further assist with C&D diversion education, training and practice.

Kerbside organic waste collection is essential, to reduce greenhouse gas emissions which are causing climate change, to optimise space in the landfill, and to provide a valuable resource with compost soil. POW recommends this action be prioritised and moved up to begin immediately. Many of POW's members rent, or live in the district seasonally, and therefore cannot compost at home, Bringing compost to a community collection site, such as Grow Wānaka isn't realistic, or accessible to everyone as you need a car, and time. Given 55% of waste in the red bins could be composted this is an action that will have a huge impact. Rubbish collection will be able to be half as frequent as it currently is, and composted organic waste can be turned into soil and sold to help cover costs. Currently it's difficult and expensive to repair gear in our district. POW is very happy to see more support for zero waste initiatives. Our members would like their gear to last longer, and to be able to be repaired easily.
