Objective 3.2.1.4	Chapter 3: Strategic Direction	Recognise and provide for tThe significant socioeconomic benefits of tourism activities across the District are provided and enabled.	Support	Federated Farmers supports the intention to provide for and enable the socioeconomic benefits of tourism activities. These activities do and should occur in the rural zones as complementary to primary production, and can underpin farming activities. We consider these activities should be provided for and enabled unless there is a significant adverse effect on rural production activities, and given other objectives pertaining to the importance of farming in the rural areas are maintained, we support this objective as reworded.
Objective 3.2.1.5	Chapter 3: Strategic Direction	Enable the dDevelopment of innovative and sustainable enterprises that contribute to diversification of the District's economic base and create employment opportunities.	Support	A broad based economy provides for sustainable socioeconomic wellbeing. In the rural areas, this diversity can underpin primary production activities, where these activities do not significantly adversely impact the farming activities that underpin the rural landscape.
Objective 3.2.1.6	Chapter 3: Strategic Direction	Recognise the potential for Diversification of land use in rural areas providing to diversify their land use beyond the strong productive value of farming, provided a sensitive approach is taken to adverse effects on rural amenity, landscape character, healthy ecosystems, and Ngai Tahu values, rights and interests are avoided, remedied or mitigated.	Oppose in part	While Federated Farmers supports the intention to provide for diversification of land use where the potential adverse impacts on specified activities are appropriately considered, and avoided, remedied or mitigated, we oppose the removal of the reference to farming activities. As this Objective relates specifically to the rural areas of the District, we consider it should reflect the intent of other Objectives by referring to the potential for adverse impacts in respect to

Support in part	The proposed re-wording better explains the intent to provide for development while ensuring indigenous biodiversity, and the life-supporting capacity of air, water, soil and ecosystems, are maintained, sustained or enhanced as appropriate. However, Federated Farmers has some concerns that the proposed wording changes council's role from promoting positive activities to a more onerous regulatory approach. Therefore we seek amendments to the proposed Objective to retain the original intention of the Objective (as highlighted below) or words to similar effect; Promote development and activities that sustain or enhance the life-supporting capacity

Oppose in part	Federated Farmers agrees with the proposal to reduce or eliminate the spreading of wilding exotic vegetation as proposed under Objective 3.2.4.4. However, we do not consider that prohibited status is required. We would support a rules based approach to addressing the risk of spreading of wilding exotic vegetation rather than restrictions on planting, and we seek that this policy is reworded as follows (as highlighted below) or words to similar effect; That Prohibit tThe risks associated with the planting of identified exotic vegetation with the potential to spread and naturalise are appropriately managed is banned.

The proposed re-wording better reflects what we consider should be the overall intent of the Objective.

Support	In our initial submissions, Federated Farmers supported the initial Objective as worded, as we considered it important that agricultural land use is not only to be expected and provided for in the rural areas of the District, but that this land use is also recognised as overall positively contributing to the visual and other amenity values that are inherently attractive to those who live in, work in and visit the District. In Federated Farmers view, the original wording of the Objective captured the

				fundamental point that the rural landscape would look significantly different, and/or would cost significantly more to maintain, if farming was not present in the rural areas.
				However, farming in the Queenstown Lakes District is also economically underpinned by the ability for individual farmers to diversify away from farming specifically to develop complementary and compatible activities that not only take advantage of, but inherently rely on, the District's nature conservation values. Therefore we support the proposed re-wording
				of the Objective as it takes a more enabling approach to other activities while still providing for agricultural production.
