

TREVOR ROBINSON

Practiced as a barrister for 15 years. Previously (for 14 years) a litigation partner in Buddle Findlay's Wellington office, and still earlier (for 3 years post admission) worked as a barrister employed by RJ Somerville QC in Dunedin.

Having practised extensively in commercial litigation and superannuation trust law while at Buddle Findlay, increasingly specialised in environmental/RMA work from the early 1990s. Barrister's practice now almost solely RMA focussed.

Sarah has worked as a planner since 1977, both as a consultant and senior local authority planner. These include local, regional and central government; energy, roading, waste management and other infrastructure agencies / companies; primary industry (irrigation, aquaculture and mining/quarrying); land development companies; and private individuals.

As an accredited RMA decision-maker, Sarah has acted an independent Commissioner for plan, resource consent and notification decisions since 1997.

From 2014 to 2016, she was a full-time member of the Independent Hearings Panel hearing and deciding submissions, and determining plan provisions, for the Christchurch Replacement District Plan.

Sarah has extensive experience in District and Regional policy and plan preparation, evaluation and implementation, as well as with the consenting process. This ranges from providing strategic planning advice, undertaking scoping, constraints and alternatives investigations, plan policy and rule drafting, to assessing the environmental and planning feasibility of proposals.
