<u>Graeme Todd – Todd & Walker Law Limited</u>

Mr Todd stated that he was speaking on behalf of two clients who were ratepayers within the district. Mr Todd expressed concerns about two recent appeals where he felt that Council had not participated in mediation appropriately. He asked that Council communicate their intentions to mediate clearly and ensure that someone with the authority to settle an appeal was always present for the exchange.
