CONTEXT | HOROPAKI

Wai Wānaka

- 1. On behalf of the Board I recently provided a letter of support for Wai Wānaka's funding application to the Rotary Club of Wānaka Charitable Trust for funding to develop riparian planting that will help to improve water quality in the Upper Clutha catchments.
- 2. If approved, this funding will receive equal match funding from Fonterra through the Million Metres Stream Project (Ministry of Environment Freshwater Improvement Fund).

Wānaka Community Board Drop-In Sessions

- 3. Wānaka Community Board relaunched its Drop-In sessions on Wednesday, 1 July and they are held between 12.00pm and 1.00pm in the meeting room at the Wānaka Recreation Centre.
- 4. They have been held monthly since launching in July and to date three sessions have been held with the number of people attending ranging from 5 to 13 people. At each, a range

of topics, questions, suggestions and concerns have been brought to the attention of the Board. The next session will be held on Wednesday, 7 October at the Wānaka Recreation Centre meeting room.

News from Upper Clutha Libraries to the Wānaka Community Board, September 2020

- 5. At the time of writing Level 2 restrictions remain in place at Upper Clutha Libraries. Library teams are becoming dab hands at moving levels and the switch from Level 1 to 2 on August 12 was seamless. Screens at circulation desk, sanitisation stations around the libraries and QR coded entry have remained through all levels, however, building capacity limits due to distancing space and entry to the library is monitored.
- 6. The demand for contactless services (MyBookBag) including 'grab a bag from the library' for delivery to housebound customers has increased. We are receiving requests from local preschools to continue librarian visits and have implemented some visits, ensuring library staff wear face masks and abide by school health and safety regulations during visits. The Wānaka and Hāwea library team members have been greeted with delight by children and staff alike who have been anticipating stories from the librarians for weeks.
- 7. Virtual events via Zoom which began during the lockdown period and remain in place include 'Conversations in English', 'Reading with Dogs' and the 'Foodie Bookclub'. Check out the library website for information: https://codc-qldc.govt.nz/ Contingency plans for the October school holidays are in place to cover changes to alert levels.
- 8. Libraries have implemented a 'no hold fees for over 70's' policy.
- 9. July 2020 hard copy checkouts were up 2% compared to July 2019 at Upper Clutha Libraries. (eResources up 72% across all libraries July comparisons).
- 10. Half page monthly book reviews are now displayed in the Upper Clutha Messenger. This appears to be generating an interest in reading from the locals, particularly, Killer Thrillers (most popular fiction in the Upper Clutha).
- 11. "Skirt Tales: The Sequel: Life Stories of 80 Women of the Upper Clutha", published by the Wānaka Women's Suffrage Committee, 2020 is being sold at Hāwea and Wānaka Libraries. Sales have been high and an interest also generated in the first edition published in 1995, now also being sold on behalf of the committee.
- 12. The Queenstown Lakes District Library Strategy 2020-2030 has been completed (with a COVID-19 overlay) and awaits adoption by the Community & Services Committee.

Wānaka Recreation Centre Activity Report

- 13. Wānaka Recreation Centre operated under Alert Level 1 until Alert Level 2 began again on August 11th 2020.
- 14. The period of Alert Level 1 saw the return of all sports leagues in a shortened capacity, which was great to see for our community. Programmes, classes and clubs also continued

- to run during Alert Level 1 indoors including QLDC Swim School and Wānaka Swim Academy, Aquafit, adult and junior badminton, netball, basketball and floorball.
- 15. Alert Level 2 has seen restrictions put back in place in terms of capacity numbers in the sports stadium and pool, alongside extra precautions around health and safety. QLDC Swim School continued to run at Level 2, with Alert Level 2 protocols in place (Wānaka Swim Academy does not run in term 3). Sports leagues continued to finish their seasons with health and safety plans in place. End of Term 3 Holiday Programme will continue to run.
