
# **INFRASTRUCTURE COMMITTEE** | Property & Infrastructure Activity Update (June 2025)

The Property & Infrastructure directorate is advancing a range of planning, behaviour change, and physical works initiatives of interest to the Infrastructure Committee. A comprehensive list of initiatives was provided to the Committee in November; this A3 provides an interim update – highlighting key areas of progress and emerging issues/risks relative to the November report.

The directorate's year-to-date capital expenditure performance is included to the right.

YTD spend (at April 2025) is \$97.1M. Forecast FY25 spend is \$120.3M vs the approved adjusted budget of \$136.0M.

In the very immediate term, P&I is particularly focussed on supporting QLDC to meet the requirements associated with Local Water Done Well.





### **PROPERTY**

- EV Charging Stations for QLDC Fleet Procurement planning underway for QEC additional charger installation.
- Wanaka Airport Conceptual options for water and wastewater infrastructure have been developed and estimated costs provided.
- Tucker Beach Closed Landfill Consenting Fencing is currently being installed to control pests, and will provide for continued access for the bike trail.
- Stanley Street Carpark Development Design documents are complete. Expect to go to market in June 2025.

### **TRANSPORT**

- Renewals & minor improvements Network reseals completed for 24/25 season. Workshops have now been completed with elected members to socialise 24-27 Minor Improvement Programme of works, with design to commence shortly.
- Crown Range & Glenorchy Road Resilience Design services currently being procured; Crown Range targeted for completion in 25/26 construction season, and Shepherds Creek bridge 26/27 season.
- Arterial Stage 1 On track for completion by 30 June; includes Lower Ballarat St stormwater, side roads, and pedestrian accessways. QA, minor omissions, and defects through to end of 2025.
- Transport Model Build RFT for the new model build expected to go to market by end of May. This joint project with NZTA /ORC will provide a step change in QLDC's transport modelling approach.
- Travel Demand Management Wayfinding scoping work now underway. Ongoing liaison with internal teams to monitor responses to policy review.
- Parking Management Plans Guidelines redrafted, PMP and Implementation plan drafts to be completed by end of September.

### **THREE WATERS**

- Renewals & minor improvements Aubrey Rd WW renewal contract awarded but start delayed until late winter to avoid issues with road reinstatement. WW main replacement on Anderson/Plantation Rd approaching completion. Design of Frankton Rd watermain renewals underway for delivery next FY.
- Compliance Response UV Treatment minor works remaining to complete Two Mile before end of May. Consenting for Luggate complete, with tender for construction works currently out to market.
- **Project Pure Aeration Grid Renewal** One reactor is currently offline and fully drained, with installation works underway.
- Upper Clutha Wastewater Conveyance Scheme Evaluation of construction tenders is underway, with contract award expected in June.
- Project Pure Future Works Masterplanning complete, moving to planning for staged delivery. Opportunities to accelerate the inlet works upgrade (dependency with UCWWCS) are being assessed.
- **Septage Disposal** Progressing towards a two stage Design & Construct process, however, works currently on hold to consider the potential benefits of bundling with the inlet works upgrade that is being explored for accelerated delivery.
- North Wanaka WW Conveyance Mediation for the NoR is ongoing. Council has provided a draft consent order and suite of conditions for the Appellants to agree to in order to resolve the Appeal. The Parties are due to report back to the Court late-May.
- Project Shotover Mechanical and electrical installation is in final stages of completion, and pre-commissioning is underway across plant elements. On track to be fully operational by December 2025.
- Shotover Disposal Field Development of shortlisted options and site investigations has commenced, with preferred option confirmation targeted by November 2025.
- Hanleys Farm WW Pump Station Construction is now underway.
- Robins Road WW Conveyance Consenting is underway, with construction now expected to begin by October 2025.
- Hāwea Water Supply LoS Improvement Physical works are underway, with electrical upgrades and pump replacement complete. WTP upgrades on track for completion in May.
- Hāwea Water Demand Management All smart meters and laterals have now been installed.
- Kingston New WS Scheme Construction is on track for completion in October 2025.
- Kingston New WW Scheme Land acquisition and easement agreements remain the main constraint to the construction programme. It is hoped construction will commence this calendar year.
- **Telemetry/SCADA** The transfer of the Lake Hayes scheme to the new SCADA platform (System Platform) well progressed as a pilot prior to migrating balance of district. Preparing for new server hardware and installation underway. Assessment of communications options to commence shortly.

#### WASTE

- New Materials Recovery Facility Procurement Strategy to be discussed at the June Infrastructure Committee workshop.
- Victoria Flats Landfill Reconsenting Early stakeholder engagement underway.
- Kerbside Greenwaste Collection An application to secure additional MfE funding support for new kerbside bins is being prepared for consideration by the Minister. This will build on the \$1.5M of approved funding already secured for this purpose. The timing of implementation remains dependant on the availability of a suitable processing facility (currently planned to be provided by CODC).
